By integrating authentic cultural costumes into their performances, the young dancers are able to more fully embody the spirit and history of Ukraine, and the other cultures they represent through dance, adding a deeply authentic element to their artistic expression.

"Our message is one of peace and understanding through the universal language of dance," said IDAC's Director. "These authentic costumes not only beautify our performances but also serve as a reminder of the strength and beauty of Ukrainian culture. We're honored to share this with our local community and to bring these stories to life on stage."

The costumes will be featured in IDAC's Festivals of Light performances this Friday and Saturday at Del Oro High School where youth from diverse backgrounds join together to perform cultural dances from around the world. With each step, they share a message of unity, resilience, and hope for a peaceful future.
